

The Library Corner: Love Through the Years You can be silly / or you can be sad You can be merry / or you can be mad You can be grumpy / or you can be glad God loves you just as you are.

The above is the beginning of a "Little Blessings" book by Kathleen Bostrom, aptly titled "God Loves You." This sweetly illustrated board book is perfect for little ones, who need to know that not only are they loved by their family, but that God loves them too. It is great for a discussion-- at their level of understanding-- about the fact that God loves them always.

For older children the library has several other books that illustrates God's love, and what it means to love others. One is Sharing God's Love: the Jesus

Creed for Children by Scot McKnight. Stan and Jan Berenstain also have a book named God Loves You that illustrates the enduring nature of God's love

"even when we do things we're not supposed to." And in an amusing version of the Good Samaritan story, the Berenstain Bears learn to Love Their Neighbors.

And since we always need to know and remember that God loves us, and also wants us to love others —not a slam dunk no matter what our age--here are

some books for adults on those same topics:

In Max Lucado's A Love Worth Giving: Living in the Overflow of God's Love Lucado says "Could it be that the secret to loving is receiving? You give love by

first receiving it. 'We love because he first loved us' "(1 John 4:19) p. 7

Two books suggest a 40-day journey, each with specific daily thoughts and actions intended to deepen the journey toward more love. One of these, The Love Dare, by Stephen and Alex Kendrick, offers insights and daily challenges for bringing more love and less friction into the relationship between spouses.


They say "If you accept this dare . . .instead of following your heart you are choosing to lead it." (p. viii) The second book, which offers daily spiritual guidance, is Deeply Loved: 40 Ways in 40 Days to Experience the Heart of Jesus by Kerri Wyatt Kent.

Finally, for older adults, consider A Deepening Love Affair: The Gift of God in Later Life, by Jane Marie Thibault. Thibault notes that she has met many older adults who are "jaded" or "who are spiritually discontented but do not know why." And she says that "I have come to believe that the development of an intense, mutual love relationship with God is the primary spiritual task of later life." (p. 19). What do you think?

In addition, we can't forget that February also brings Valentine's Day, and thoughts of being in love. We have some fiction with a little romance in them as well. Check it out!

You will find these plus other books in the upstairs hall, and downstairs in the hall or in the library.

Diana O'Toole is perfectly on track. She will be married by thirty, done having kids by thirty-five, and move out to the New York City suburbs, all while climbing the professional ladder in the cutthroat art auction world. She's not engaged just yet, but she knows her boyfriend, Finn, a surgical resident, is about to propose on their romantic getaway to the Galápagos—days before her thirtieth birthday. Right on time.

But then a virus that felt worlds away has appeared in the city, and Finn breaks the news: It's all hands on deck at the hospital. He has to stay behind. You should still go, he assures her, it would be a shame for all their nonrefundable trip to go to waste. Reluctantly, she goes.

Almost immediately, Diana's dream vacation goes awry. Her luggage is lost, the Wi-Fi is nearly nonexistent, and the hotel they'd booked is shut down due to the pandemic. In fact, the whole island is now under quarantine, and she is stranded until the borders reopen. Completely isolated, she must venture beyond her comfort zone. . . In the Galápagos Islands, where Darwin's theory of evolution by natural selection was formed, Diana finds herself examining her relationships, her choices, and herself—and wondering if when she goes home, she too will have evolved into someone completely different.







We are happily looking forward to Summer Camp 2023 already! The pricing structure will be the same as last year. MUMC will split the cost of camp with parents 50/50. Parents can either pay the entire 50%, or if needed,



apply for a scholarship that will split the cost into thirds—parents pay 1/3rd (\$25 minimum), church pays 1/3rd, and the scholarship fund will cover the remaining third. We trust families to do what they can genuinely afford, and *the registration choices of parents will be held in strictest confidence*. Members are also welcome to sponsor an individual youth/child to participate in camp if they wish.

Each participant may bring one friend that will be offered the same payment options as above. The only additional requirement is that they attend our Camp Sunday event, June 4th, so the church can pray over and bless the kids for their upcoming trip to camp.

Children will be participating in several fundraising events to supply the scholarship fund in the coming months. These events are to-be-announced.
