"AN INVITATION FOR A NEW BEGINNING"

Christ is many things to the church, dynamic in presentation. His dynamic nature saves us alive; establishing our eternity, structuring our present, and molding our emotional state through character enrichment nestled in correction and encouragement. In all of this He has a prevailing component which most overlook. Christ is invitational!

²⁸Come unto me, all ye that labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find

rest unto your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light. (**Mt 11:28-30**) As we witness our world slowly crumble into a cesspool of debaucheries, our church declining as it cannot collectively determine what God says, and few able to bravely articulate God's Word in love, I want to be invitational to you whom I am responsible for. I invite those who would profess to be Republicans and conservative in their theology to truly embrace holiness and let the **Word of God** define sin and how to deal with it. For He is the author of holiness. I invite those who would profess to be Democrats and liberal in their theology to truly embrace Justice and let the **Word of God** define sin and how to deal with it. For He is the author of Justice. My invitation is to both sides; to understand that you are always on the wrong side

until you get on God's side. This is the lesson an embattled Joshua had to learn.

¹³ And it came to pass, when Joshua was by Jericho, that he lifted up his eyes and looked, and, behold, there stood a man over against him with his sword drawn in his hand: and Joshua went unto him, and said unto him, Art thou for us, or for our adversaries?¹⁴ And he said, Nay; but as captain of the host of the LORD am I now come. And Joshua fell on his face to the earth, and did worship, and said unto him, What saith my Lord unto his servant?

The word 'NAY' is best translated as "No, neither..." Church we cannot afford to be on the side of a political party, a social justice group, or any sociopolitical organization. We serve the Captain of the Hosts of the Lord's army! We need to hear from Him and Him alone! The invitation I want to offer is the opportunity to allow God to create in you a clean heart, and to renew a right spirit within you. It's an invitation to a new beginning for you. Not some other group, not some other person, but the only one you can control; yourself!

I invite you to journey with me in a collective Bible Study called; *"One Story That Leads to Jesus"*. As we prepare for the Lenten season, Resurrection and Ascension Sunday; let us make a commitment to serve God beyond a season. Let us make a commitment to serve God collectively in learning about Him. Let's be invitational to one another; confessing that we really don't know, and that we can only begin to understand who He is and what He is calling us to as we gather in humility and love around His Word. The Library Corner: Drawing Nearer

We are all familiar with the hymn that pleads "Draw me nearer, nearer Blessed Lord" but do we always feel that we are drawing nearer? In reality what we think about, and how we spend our time, help define what is important to us. But for many people the busy modernday life we lead leaves precious little time to focus on our faith in God and our relationship to Jesus.

If we are honest with ourselves, we probably know what we need. Prayer time where we listen as well as pray. Thoughtful reading of Scripture. And many other ways if we pay attention! One of those ways is the judicious reading of books that can reinforce and deepen our knowledge and our faith. Here are a few in the church library that may be helpful:

Discerning the Voice of God: How to Recognize When God is Speaking by Priscilla Shirer. Shirer explores the truth that God wants to communicate with each one of us—not just the people in Biblical times—and, she says, God will find a way.

The Joy of Listening to God: Hearing the Many Ways God Speaks to Us by Joyce Huggett. A self-described "ordinary Christian" who regularly told God her problems and her desires, Huggett gradually discovered the power of silence, which opened up a whole new way of hearing God.

Jesus: The God Who Knows Your Name by Max Lucado. The library has both the book and a DVD. In his easy-going but focused style, Lucado discusses many facets of Jesus— Immanuel, Friend, Teacher, Miracle Worker, Lamb of God, and Returning King.

By the time you read this article we will already be in the season of Lent. Perhaps you will have seen Lenten related books already on display. Here are a few.

Lent in Plain Sight by Jill J. Duffield. The author provides a Bible reading, a devotion, questions for reflection, and a prayer for each day of Lent. Topics of the devotions are very ordinary objects, but all are related to Jesus' life and to ours. The result is an excellent devotional.

24 Hours that Changed the World by Adam Hamilton. This illuminating book, along with a DVD that was shot on location in Israel, takes us through the last hours of Jesus' life, and his death on the Cross. The book ends with a chapter called "Christ the Victor."

These and other books and DVDs will be on display on the library bookcase upstairs, the downstairs table, and in the library.
