### A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Spring 2023 Yard Sale

During the month of April the season of Lent is winding down. A period of time every year when we give thoughtful consideration to, and reflect on, the sacrifice that Jesus made on the cross for our sins - as we make our own Lenten sacrifices - in preparation of the celebration that is Resurrection Sunday. However, as a body of believers, we are called to continue to make sacrifices throughout the year – sacrifices of our time, talents, and money. And, one of the ways that we, as Murphysboro United Methodist Church, sacrifice our time, talents, and money is through the semi-annual church yard sale that is held in April and October every

This year, the yard sale is being held Friday, April 28 from 1 to 6 pm, and Saturday, April 29 from 8 to 11 am. But, in order to prepare for this sale that benefits a variety of Service and Missions projects within the church, our youth group, and individuals and groups that are part of the Murphysboro community, it requires a great deal of time and effort on the part of the ladies and men that assist with this project year after year. For the Spring Yard Sale, the work begins on April 17 and doesn't end until the last item has been sold or donated on April 29. That equals two solid weeks of work for the volunteers, during each of the months of April and October - or four weeks total during the year - a true sacrifice of time. The interesting thing is that the same people keep returning to help year after year, and new people continue to join the ranks of the volunteers. Why, you may ask? Here are a couple of quotes from a newer volunteer, and a seasoned volunteer, as to why they choose to be part of the church yard sale team: "Knowing that I am helping my community shop at great prices, and some even receive free items that they really need, just makes my heart feel good." Kathy Ripley "Having the time for fellowship with my church family and doing something awesome for my community. God is good!" Barb Hughes

Because these individuals realize that the work they do makes a difference to our church and to our community, and that it is also a wonderful opportunity to fellowship with members of our church family, it keeps them coming back to volunteer year after year and why the sacrifice of their time and talents is not really a sacrifice at all. Lynn Pierson, the long-time Coordinator of this event shared that "there is just something about opening that door on Friday," and she invites everyone to "come and join the fun!" Lynn realizes that the mission projects of the church will benefit, the individuals that come to shop will benefit, and the community as a whole will benefit. The proceeds from the yard sale have provided refrigerators for the church kitchen which is used to hold supplies for church potlucks, funeral dinners, and Our Neighbors Table – a free lunch on the last Sunday of the month that is open to the community. And, communities as far away as Mayfield, KY and Dresden, TN have been blessed by the proceeds from the church yard sale when members of our church felt called to help out those impacted by the December 2021 tornados by purchasing bottled water, cleaning supplies, hygiene products, Christmas gifts, etc. Yes, it's about helping Murphysboro United Methodist Church, and it's about helping the community of Murphysboro, but it's also about reaching out and helping whenever we can and wherever we can, as God leads us.

I want to close with one of my favorite passages of scripture: "Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. This is how God showed His Love among us: He sent His one and only Son into the world that we might live through Him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another." 1 John 4:7-11 (NIV)

#### The Library Corner: Easter and Hope

Easter is quickly approaching, but there is still time to immerse yourself in the events of the crucifixion and Resurrection. Here are two items in the church library that can bring us closer to the most important time in history:

Final Words from the Cross. Author Adam Hamilton discusses the final words of Jesus as he was dying, using the accounts in all four Gospels. Altogether there are seven statements, starting with "Father forgive them for they do not know what they are doing." Do you remember the other statements? But these important words from the cross were not Jesus' last words. As Hamilton says "The powerful and joyous message of Easter is that there were words after that." (p. 117) Those words are discussed in the book's final chapter. In addition to the book the library has a 4CD audio version, plus a DVD of Hamilton's discussion.

**Risen** is a DVD movie starring Joseph Fiennes as a Roman military tribune who is charged with the task of solving the mystery of what happened to Jesus in the weeks following the crucifixion. The Romans are motivated to disprove rumors of a risen Messiah. This movie is fiction, but it still takes the viewer back to first A.D. Jerusalem and immerses one in that time of turmoil and hope.

Speaking of hope, here are three books discussing various aspects of Christian hope:


Looking Up When Life is Looking Down by Beth Moore. Using Psalm 40, other Bible verses, and her own life experiences, Moore discusses how to get out of the "miry clay" and find hope and deliverance. "He also brought me up out of a horrible pit /out of the miry clay / and set my feet upon a rock /and established my steps. / He has put a new song in my mouth (Psalm 40: 2-3a NLT)

In different chapters of **HOPE: An Anchor for Life**, Dr. David Jeremiah discusses various aspects of hope—choosing hope over worry, heavenly hope, hope for my neighbor, etc. And he says "Hope isn't a feeling or a philosophical concept. It's the reality of a relationship with the living God..." (p. 4)

In her first book, "Kisses from Katie", Katie Davis Majors discussed her move to Uganda, and becoming the adoptive mother to thirteen Ugandan girls. In her latest book Daring to hope: Finding God's Goodness in the Broken and the Beautiful, Katie describes happiness, but also sorrow and heartache. She wrestles with her questions, and through her reading of the Bible stories and applying their meanings to her life, she dares to hope, even in dark times.

You will find these and other books downstairs in the library, and upstairs on the library bookcase.
