

The Library Corner: Helpful Books

Helpful books? There are a lot of books in that category! There are books that help solve a problem or situation, books that help us re-think an issue, books that encourage and inspire us to grow, and more. Of course, whether any particular book is truly helpful depends on the needs of the reader. So the following "helpful" list is a bit arbitrary, and is only a sample of the possibilities to be found in the church library.

Financial Peace Revisited. Dave Ramsey says he learned about strategies for financial peace only after being "caught up to my eyeballs in debt." But you do not have to be up to your eyeballs in debt to appreciate his advice about debt reduction, relationships and money, and taking control of finances.


But as you know there is more to peace than finances! In Experiencing Peace: With God You Can Live Beyond Fear, author Margaret Feinberg uses questions and Bible verses to address topics such as saying goodbye to unhealthy fear, embracing God's peace, and bringing peace to others.

The workbook format allows for deeper exploration of these issues, but do use a separate notebook for your answers! A book by Adam Hamilton, **Unafraid**, also takes a thoughtful and faithful approach to dealing with fear.

Along with two physicians, Rick Warren, a nationally known pastor, has written **The Daniel Plan: 40 Days to a Healthier Life.** They delve into five categories: **faith, food, fitness, focus, and friends.** It is a good guide for individuals, and a good resource for a class or group-- many people in Warren's church joined him in this program. There are multiple copies of this book in the library.

Keeping Love Alive as Memories Fade: The 5 Love Languages and the Alzheimer's Journey by Gary Chapman and two others. They offer facts, anecdotes, and guidance for people who are caregivers of loved ones who have been affected by this disease. Companions in Christ: The Way of Forgiveness by Marjorie Thompson. Companions in Christ is a series of books designed for small groups, all meant to bring participants closer to God, buy individuals can use it as well. Forgiveness is surely one of the harder issues we face. Sections in this participant book include Living in God's Blessing, Receiving God's Forgiveness, Forgiving Others, and Seeking Reconciliation.

Perhaps one of these books will helpful to you! These and other books will be on display upstairs and downstairs, including the church library.

Demon CopperheadBy Barabara Kingsolver

Demon Copperhead is set in the mountains of southern Appalachia. It's the story of a boy born to a teenaged single mother in a single-wide trailer, with no assets beyond his dead father's good looks and copper-colored hair, a caustic wit, and a fierce talent for survival. In a plot that never pauses for breath, relayed in his own unsparing voice, he braves the modern perils of foster care, child labor, derelict schools, athletic success, addiction, disastrous loves, and crushing losses. Through all of it, he reckons with his own invisibility in a popular culture where even the superheroes have abandoned rural people in favor of cities.

Many generations ago, Charles Dickens wrote David Copperfield from his experience as a survivor of institutional poverty and its damages to children in his society. Those problems have yet to be solved in ours. Dickens is not a prerequisite for readers of this novel, but he provided its inspiration. In transposing a Victorian epic novel to the contemporary American South, Barbara Kingsolver enlists Dickens' anger and compassion, and above all, his faith in the transformative powers of a good story. Demon Copperhead speaks for a new generation of lost boys, and all those born into beautiful, cursed places they can't imagine leaving behind.


