





"GOD OF THE HARVEST: FAITH, LOVE, AND MERCY"

Oh, give thanks unto the Lord for He is good. Are these idle words or Words of life? I think the answer is dependent on who answers. For the unsaved, maybe not so much of a good God is to be identified. But for the saved and transformed of God, He is good with a mercy that endures forever. Our testimony today as a believing body; a people who have been saved by faith through grace, and transformed by the renewing of our minds is that God is good! This is our song as we enter into this harvest season.

Make a joyful noise unto the LORD, all ye lands. ² Serve the LORD with gladness: come before his presence with singing. Psalm 100:1-2

Despite our continued moral and ethical decline, we enjoy an abundance of opportunity and access to basic needs rarely seen in post-modern history. It is not common to have access to school, medical care, or food at such levels as we've seen and experienced in this country. Let us remember that God is God alone, our creator and friend. During this harvest season will you allow God to harvest your heart; that you may envision Him as sole proprietor of all things. What might it mean to see God truly as the sole proprietor of all things? I beg you to consider it. How does that change what you say? In what ways does that limit how you use your body? What are the implications concerning the things you think about, which people you love, and those you dislike or even hate. How are we to live our lives if our lives truly belong to the one true and living God?

³ Know ye that the LORD he is God: it is he that hath made us, and not we ourselves; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. Psalm 100:3

I am humbly calling you to end all lip service faith and holy posturing which is of no-good effect. These things are akin to a poor and unfruitful harvest though much work has gone into the desired end. You are called to a field ripe for harvest; that being the fruit within God intends to cultivate and the fruit without which God desires to pluck and bring into the storehouse of eternity. So, submit your body as a living sacrifice unto God. Put away all sin and every weight that comes upon you so easily. Connect yourself to our weekly Bible Study, develop a schedule for personal prayer and the reading of God's Word. Explore the principles of fasting and consult your doctor, but fast and pray. Expect that God will overtake you and those you pray for. Expect Him to rush into your situation and transform you first and then the things around you if necessary.

Come to God with everything you have while surrendering everything you must. Rush toward *grace*, which is getting what you don't deserve, and *mercy* which is not getting what you deserve... In all things give thanks. Amen!



The Library Corner: Blessings Abound

Blessings come to us in many ways—here are two: one is a devotional that has spoken to so many people, and another is through the companionship and love of animals.

First, a little bit about the writer of the devotional that over the years sold more than 45 million copies, and has been a blessing to many people. The writer is Sarah Young, and the devotional is **Jesus Calling.** Sarah just died in August, at age 77, and she will be well remembered.

As Sarah discusses in her introduction to **Jesus Calling**, she was not originally a believer, but later became a devout Christian. She attended Covenant Theological Seminary, went to Japan as a missionary with her husband, and became a Christian counselor.

Jesus Calling and subsequent books are written from the perspective of Jesus speaking to the reader personally, and is based on Bible verses from both the Old and New Testament, which are given along with each devotion. It can be remarkably effective in making readers feel closer to Jesus and to Scripture.

We will have several of Sarah's books on display—if you haven't read any of them, check one out and give it a try.

Second, don't forget the **Blessing of the Animals!** It will be Sunday the 1st of October. Animal lovers, rejoice over this event which is sponsored by our church in cooperation with the animal rescue group, St. Francis Care. Will the animal you bring know that it has been blessed? Well, perhaps not, -- or?? But you will know. Contact Michelle Parker -Clark if you have questions.

Thanks to someone on the library team who loves animals dearly, the library happens to have some books and DVDs about animals, especially about pets and their people. Some examples:

Seabiscuit: **An American Legend** by Lauren Hillebrand. Seabiscuit was an extraordinary horse, and Hillebrand is an extraordinarily good writer. It is a combination that makes a great read.

Homer's Odyssey: A Fearless Feline Tale, or How I Learned about Love and Life with a Blind Wonder Cat by Gwen Cooper. A true story about an eyeless kitten, who grows into a "three-pound dynamo" that changes Cooper's life.

Finding Gobi: The Amazing True Story by Dion Leonard. Leonard is an ultramarathon runner racing across the Gobi Desert. He doesn't need a dog. But a little pup crosses his path, and the two become devoted to one another. Then . . . well, you will just have to read it. We have both the adult and the youth version of this story.

Killers of the Flower Moon

by David Grann

In the 1920s, the richest people per capita in the world were members of the Osage Nation in Oklahoma. After oil was discovered beneath their land, the Osage rode in chauffeured automobiles, built mansions, and sent their children to study in Europe. Then, one by one, the Osage began to be killed off. The family of an Osage woman, Mollie Burkhart, became a prime target. One of her relatives was shot. Another was poisoned. And it was just the beginning, as more and more Osage were dying under mysterious circumstances, and many of those who dared to investigate the killings were themselves murdered.

As the death toll rose, the newly created FBI took up the case, and the young director, J. Edgar Hoover, turned to a former Texas Ranger named Tom White to try to unravel the mystery. White put together an undercover team, including a Native American agent who infiltrated the region, and together with the Osage began to expose one of the most chilling conspiracies in American history.
