GOD'S KINGDOM: CONFIRMATIONS AND BAPTISMS

We just finished the sermon series "The Kingdom of God". If we were to choose one idea most important to Jesus it would be 'The Kingdom of God'. It was His topical preoccupation when preaching to the masses. The Kingdom of God conceptually represented the foundational mindset Jesus wanted followers to access; that their faith formation would begin with the idea of a sovereign God ruling over His loyal subjects. Such a concept would color and solidify a reverent, awe-inspiring approach of every so-called Christian.

The earth is the Lord's, and the fulness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein. For he hath founded it upon the seas and established it upon the floods. Who shall ascend into the hill of the Lord? or who shall stand in his holy place? He that hath clean hands, and a pure heart; who hath not lifted up his soul unto vanity, nor sworn deceitfully. He shall receive the blessing from the Lord, and righteousness from the God of his salvation. This is the generation of them that seek him, that seek thy face, O Jacob. Selah. Lift up your heads, O ye gates; and be ye lift up, ye everlasting doors; and the King of glory shall come in. Who is this King of glory? The Lord strong and mighty, the Lord mighty in battle... (Psalm 100:1-8)

The King has established His Kingdom on earth through us. One of the ways that heaven gently touches our world is when our obedience to be living witnesses, refuge, and voice of God toward others result in Confirmation and Baptism. This is our pay-day, our moment of joy, our proof of an invisible God working in the visible world!

9 Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: 20 Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen. (Matthew 28:19-20)

In August we will have faithfully made available through *signs & acts* the rites of Confirmation and Baptism for those who would answer the Holy Spirit's calling to come nearer. We will stand as faithful witness and tangible support for those who would undertake this wondrous journey of being 'born again' in God through Christ, and by the power of the Holy Spirit!

There was a man of the Pharisees, named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews: 2 The same came to Jesus by night, and said unto him, Rabbi, we know that thou art a teacher come from God: for no man can do these miracles that thou doest, except God be with him. 3 Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God. (John 3:1-3)

It is my deepest hope that each of you who are already baptized prepare your children for confirmation and consider requesting of your pastors to '*remember your baptism*'. It's a sacramental *act of* expressing one's faith through the *sign* of water to help you rediscover the mystery of your baptism, when you experienced God's calling so many years ago. Consider preparing for your special day through prayer and study of God's Word. This will ensure that your faithful re-engaging of the holy waters will be effectual in revealing God's ongoing work in your life! Let us keep these holy acts in view year-round, looking for every opportunity to be invitational images of Christ. May God richly bless you.

A Gentle Plea


Unfortunately, we are currently very short of good books for the Little Free Library! There are a lot of readers in the congregation and we hope you might help by donating some books you no longer need.

The Little Free Library (LFL) is located by the sidewalk close to our pavilion on 16th St. You have probably noticed it— a box on "legs," painted in cheerful colors, where people can either leave books for others or take out books of interest. Simply put, it is a book exchange box, and anyone can use it.

Here is some more information:

Q. What is the purpose of the LFL?

A. First, it serves as a quiet outreach to our neighborhood and to anyone in Murphysboro who would like to use it, including our own congregation. Second, it supports education, learning, and the



Q. What kind of books do we put in the LFL?

A. One important thing is that we try to keep a few books with religious themes in the box, because that may be the very thing people are looking for. But keep in mind that since this is a book exchange box, anyone can put books in the box, and they do! Plus, we try to add books of general interest to help keep the contents varied. Here are some of the types of books we can use: Bibles, Cookbooks, History, Military History, Mysteries, Fiction, Romance (not too steamy) Devotionals or other faith related books, and Children and Youth Books (from babyhood on up).

Q. How can I donate books to the LFL?

- A. The easiest way to donate is just to place them in the box. Please feel free to take a book from the box also (remember it is a book exchange box)! If you have a number of books to donate, you can bring them down to the Church Library and leave them there. We will use what we can! Some things might end up being passed along to other places.
- Q. Any other information that would be useful?
- A. Good children's books are especially needed. The good ones usually fly out of the box! Also, books that are in good condition are more appealing. Books in poor shape are usually not taken. Do you have further questions? Contact Susan Patterson or Trina Eaton—we will be happy to talk with you!
