ADVENT

Leading up to Christmas day we will celebrate 4 weeks of Advent this year. We will light four candles to define the nature of His coming and proclaim a vicarious birth of our Lord and Savior upon lighting the fifth and final candle. But what might it mean? Beyond what you were taught about its meaning, what might God be communicating to you this year? How might HOPE, PEACE, JOY AND LOVE become alive in your life and become real forces that positively affect the world around you.

Hope suggests much from a biblical perspective. If you hope for a Savior, you concede you require saving. The next logical question is saving from what? The answer is, from yourself (sin) and the subsequent eternal hell assigned to sinners. But what virtue do we obtain through the embracing of hope. We obtain at least the strength of *humility*. You see to admit that something is wrong with oneself that requires help from another is humility. To be intimate with your faults, to own them suggests the capacity to honor the same humanity in others. Hope in this sense creates character that expects personal transformation in Christ while providing room for others to enjoy the same.

"All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned everyone to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all." (Isaiah 53:6)

Peace speaks to an internal and external reordering of our reality so as to positively change feelings and behaviors. Isaiah says that Jesus is the Prince of Peace! Having a Prince of Peace can be difficult to digest when you live in a world infiltrated and overcome with chaos. However, this conflicted concept exhibits the preeminence and power of Christ in your life. Here you rejoice in the impossible; that in the midst of chaos Christ offers peace. In this sense you become more than a conqueror through Him that loves you. Your circumstances may not change, but an abiding hope of understanding overtakes you, and you find peace.

⁷Casting all your care upon him; for he cares for you. (1Peter 5:7)

Joy is characterized by a happiness unrelated to external realities and wholly centered on the nature and promises of God. However, the Joy Candle is wholly celebrating God and what He is doing, the birth of His son, in the world. Joy suggests that you have dynamic power and not limited to a happy expectation of God, but also His manifestation in your life! Your life in Christ is content with little, but this joy rejoices because God has added much!

⁹ When they had heard the king, they departed; and, lo, the star, which they saw in the east, went before them, till it came and stood over where the young child was.¹⁰ When they saw the star, they rejoiced with exceeding great joy.¹¹ And when they were come into the house, they saw the young child with Mary his mother, and fell down, and worshipped him: and when they had opened their treasures, they presented unto him gifts; gold, and frankincense and myrrh.¹² And being warned of God in a dream that they should not return to Herod, they departed into their own country another way.

Love is characterized by an unmerited favor which pervades your life, even redefining the very nature of thought, feeling, and action as one ponders the remarkable depth of God's love for humanity. You become fully human because of this love; spiritually and emotionally. Love on this level suggests your capacity to heal all things, bare all things, share all things, and be all things for another.

¹⁷ For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved. (John 3:16-17)

Advent is not what happened, church. Advent is who you are becoming and what you will be. Advent is a barometer for our spiritual and interpersonal lives, gauging in a juxtaposed fashion the heart of God to your very own. Advent for you is not a season, but a way of life. Amen

> This Is Happiness By Niall Williams

The rain is stopping. Nobody in the small, forgotten village of Faha remembers when it started; rain on the western seaboard was a condition of living. Now—just as Father Coffey proclaims the coming of electricity—it is stopping.

Seventeen-year-old Noel Crowe is standing outside his grandparents' house shortly after the rain has stopped when he encounters Christy for the first time. Though he can't explain it, Noel knows right then: something has changed. This is the story of all that was to follow: Christy's long-lost love and why he had come to Faha, Noel's own experiences falling in and out of love, and the endlessly postponed arrival of electricity—a development that, once complete, would leave behind a world that had not changed for centuries.

Niall Williams' latest novel is an intricately observed portrait of a community. Luminous and otherworldly, and yet anchored with deep-running roots into the earthy and the everyday, *This Is Happiness* is about stories as the very stuff of life.

TITHE AND OFFERING OPTIONS

Hello church. As you may be aware, General Conference 2024 saw significant changes in the LGBTQ stance the United Methodist Church had traditionally taken. This new stance means that district and conference funds will be used to affirm and promote the LGBTQ ideology. The church is in many ways still divided on the issue. Some see this as a blessing and others view this as sin.

The purpose of this correspondence is not to argue either side. Our goal is to inform you of new giving options the SAS Board for Murphysboro UMC has created, which allows each individual to give according to their conscious without sacrificing one's theological stance or support of the local church. Basically, we have created two giving options:

LOCAL CHURCH ONLY

LOCAL CHURCH/DISTRICT & CONFERENCE

'LOCAL CHURCH ONLY' means that your entire offering will be used to manage your local church. In this instance, Murphysboro United Methodist Church alone. No funds will be directed toward the district or conference.

'LOCAL CHURCH/DISTRICT & CONFERENCE' means that your entire offering will be divided amongst the 3 entities listed; your local church, which is Murphysboro UMC, the South District of the Illinois Great River Conference, and IGRC itself. The portions will be determined by the percentage designated by the IGRC for apportionments. (see next page)

Please be advised that the board has unanimously voted YES in approving this giving option. The new giving envelopes will reflect these options, online giving will be updated as well to reflect the options. If you use neither, we ask that you identify on your check, money order, or envelope/package you use to give what your preference is.

It is the hope of the SAS Board that this will allow all to give in support of the local church, Murphysboro UMC, and preserve what we have created here despite the difference of opinions on the subject. We are a church, and the Bible is still our center. Subsequently, we encourage everyone to search the scriptures and learn for yourself what God requires. Grow in Christ first and the church will grow as a result.

IGRC 2025 Apportionment Calculation

Year-End Reporting

At the beginning of each year the local church completes their statistical data through AC Stats reporting. There are three electronic forms to fill out named Table I, Table II and Table III.

Table II Operational Expenses Used in Apportionment Calculation

The church reports expenditures on Table II of AC Stats. The numbers reported on lines 39-47 are the salaries, benefits, programming and operational expenses of the church. The 2025 apportionment calculation uses the 2023 information.

Line 39 = Direct-Billed Benefits for clergy (usually Pension, but not Health Insurance) Line 40 = Direct-Billed Health Insurance (church portion of the bill, for the IGRC the healthcare allowance is used) Line 41a = Pastor's Salary Line 41b = Associate pastor's salary (if one is present) Line 41c = Deacon's salary (if one is present) Line 42 = Housing, utilities and other cash allowances paid for/to the pastor or pastors Line 43 = Accountable Reimbursements (including travel) paid to the pastor Line 44 = Other Cash allowances to/for the pastor that are not in an accountable reimbursement plan Line 45 = Salary & Benefits for Diaconal Ministers (if present) and other staff compensation (usually lay staff)

Line 46 = Current expenses for program (including Church School)

Line 47 = Other current operating expenses (e.g., building insurance, utilities, maintenance)

What is absent from the calculation are any expenses associated with new building costs, capital improvements, debt service, apportionments, missions, or other benevolent causes. Please note membership and attendance has no bearing on the calculation.

Apportionment Percentage Calculation

Lines 39-47 are added together for the individual church operational expense dollar total. The 2024 Annual Conference approved 11.50% for the apportionment percentage.

2023 Annual Conference approves 11.50% as the 2025 Apportionment Percentage

Each church uses the same approved percentage of their operational expenses. The 2025 percentage is 11.50%. For comparison, the 2024 percentage is 12.96%. The percentage of this calculation for each church is rounded a whole dollar amount to be paid each month. Since 2012, the apportionment percentage has been between 12-15% of the local church operational expense. 11.5% is the lowest percentage in the IGRC history.

Apportionment Dollar Calculation

The Apportionment percentage is the same for each church, however the Apportionment percentage is multiplied by the total operational expense of each church. Each church has a different operational expense resulting in a different apportionment amount.

Individual Church Operational Expenses (sum of lines 39-47) X Apportionment Percentage (2025 = 11.50%) = Local Church Apportionment Dollars

A local church Apportionment can change from year to year due to a change in the local church operational expenses, and the Annual Conference approved IGRC Annual Budget and apportionment percentage.

Apportionment Statements

The monthly apportionment statement is your share of the Conference Budget which has been approved by the members of the Annual Conference. Please note the apportionments are based on local church reporting. The Finance and Administration office never questions a report submitted by the local church.

Error in Reporting for Apportionment Calculation

If a church thinks they made an AC Stats error in reporting, an email request must be sent to the Conference Council of Finance and Administration (CCFA) for consideration to mpotts@igrc.org. CCFA only considers requests for the current and future year.
