We have much to celebrate at Murphysboro United Methodist Church. We are the longest continuing congregation in Jackson County which also makes us the oldest church in Murphysboro. Our roots started down the road in the Jackson County seat of Brownsville in 1825 when the Illinois Methodist Conference established the Brownsville Circuit. Our first pastor was Josiah Patterson. When the courthouse burned in 1843, Dr. John Logan donated 20 acres of land to establish a new county seat in what became known as Murphysboro, which was more centrally located. When the town moved, so did the Methodist Church. The congregation first started

meeting in a small, log schoolhouse located where the Jackson County jail now stands. Early trustees of the church were Benningsen Boon, Lt. Governor Alexander M. Jenkins, and Thomas Manning Logan. In 1856 a frame church was built at 12th and Chestnut Streets which is now the site of the Masonic Temple, and the first parsonage was built at 10th and Locust with Rev. John G. Hardy as pastor. In 1881, a brick church was built on North 15th Street between Pine and Elm Streets. The Methodist membership continued to grow, and this church became too small for the size of its congregation. So, in 1912 the church took a leap of faith and decided to build a new church on the corner of 15th and Pine Streets for an estimated cost of \$45,000. By the time the building was completed the cost had risen to \$62,000, with another \$13,000 spent to furnish the church. Rev. Cameron Harmon served as pastor and labored at all tasks of building during the process. It is said that he climbed to the highest turret to place the last stone when others were afraid to climb to that height. To raise money to help furnish the church, the Ladies Aid Society originated its first rummage sale which has become a noted tradition of our church.

For many years there were two Methodist congregations in Murphysboro. In 1867 due to political differences following the Civil War, a group broke away from the Methodist Episcopal Church and formed the Methodist Church – South. The main benefactor of the church was none other than Elizabeth Logan, mother of Union General John A. Logan. They built a church on the southeast corner of 12th and Locust streets. However, after Mother Logan died the church was unable to keep up the payments and they lost the church and temporarily disbanded. In 1884, John A. Logan donated a city lot to the church, and they rebuilt a frame church on the corner of 7th and Walnut Streets where the Nazarene Church now stands. In 1921, they built a fine brick church on the corner of 14th and South Street and renamed the church Centenary Methodist Church.

In 1939, the union of the Methodist Protestant Church, The Methodist Episcopal Church and the Methodist Episcopal Church, South all joined together to become the Methodist Church. It wasn't until 1966 that the two Murphysboro churches approved the Proposal on Union, and the two churches merged as the United Methodist Church. In 1968, using the same red limestone rock, the Education Wing was built connecting to the former First Methodist Church. Rev. William Lewis was the first pastor of the combined churches. Since its founding 200 years ago, the Murphysboro United Methodist Church has been served by over 90 different pastors. The congregation has gone through lean times and prosperous times, but they have always tried to follow the 3 Simple Rules of John Wesley: Do No Harm, Do Good, and Stay in Love with God. We worship and serve to be disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

So why are we celebrating this 200th Anniversary? Let's look to Romans 15:4-6. "For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through the endurance taught in the Scriptures and the encouragement they provide we might have hope. May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had, so that with one mind and one voice you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ."
